

Overview

The Institute of Occupational Safety and Health has developed this course to improve workplace safety by providing workers with the knowledge required to ensure that their actions contribute to health and safety and that individual responsibilities are clearly understood.

Working safely trains workers to ensure that their actions contribute to Health and Safety in the workplace and that individual responsibilities are clearly understood. Ideally the course should be delivered as part of an induction programme, but is can also form part of on going training. Taking a minimum of six hours to complete, the courses format can be modified to suit each organisations needs.



This course is appropriate for all workers, and is ideal for use as part of an overall induction package.

The course is for employees from an industry sector who have no managerial or supervisory responsibilities.

Course Content

Delegates will be given an insight into health and safety practices, learning about their legal responsibilities to themselves, their employer and others, according to current legislation.

- Defining what is meant by safe working
- Identify sources of hazards and risks
- Understanding of workplace precautions for control of common workplace hazards and risks including fire, manual handling, electricity, work equipment, chemicals and substances, movement of people, housekeeping and noise etc.
- How to seek advise on workplace precautions and assist management in risk assessment and risk control
- The importance of contributing to the improvement of the organisations safety performance through individual compliance with the employers safety policy and management systems; reporting of accidents; consulting and communication with supervisors and management on safety issues and identifying competence for safe working
